Strong Passwords

Secure passwords are necessary to protect account and personal information. Strong passwords should:

- Contain at least 8 characters
- Contain a mix of upper and lower case letters, numbers and symbols
- Not be possible to guess (eg your name, your pet's name etc)
- Be changed regularly

Weak password: password12345

Strong password: C&tCF1mFb (remember: Charlie and the Chocolate Factory is my favourite book)

<u>Digital Citizenship</u>


Digital citizenship is being part of a community that use the internet. A digital citizen should:

- Be respectful
- Treat people online in the same way as they would normally do
- Understand that what you do and look at on the internet leaves a trail that others can see.

Recognising Tricks and Scams

It is an unfortunate fact that there are many people trying to trick you on the internet. You might come across these common tricks:

- Pop up messages that sound too good to be true (for example, you've won a prize)
- Emails from unknown sources that contain links or files
- Videos or photos that want you to click on a link

Safe Online Research

The internet has made researching topics easier than ever before. Yet there are things we need to be aware of:

- Information should be checked by using more than one source
- Don't copy and paste chunks of text - this is called plagiarism and is against the law
- Only use trusted sites, such as BBC.co.uk

Photorealistic?

There are many real and edited photos on the internet, and it can be difficult to tell which are which. We teach children that:

- It is easy to alter and edit images using a computer
- They should think about who uploaded the picture and for what purpose
- They shouldn't compare themselves to the standard set by some peoples on the internet

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
