

Did you know that **chronological** has two parts ?


Chrono = Time

Logic = Order

So, if we place these events in the order that they happen. It would look like this...

1. Woke up late
2. Got ready
3. Rode bike to school
4. Saw people outside.

Chronological Order



Let's use the **same events** but write them in chronological order with more detail.

Example:

This morning was crazy. My alarm clock was set for PM instead of AM, so I woke up really late. I just threw on some clothes and ran out the door. I rode my bike as fast as I could and thought that I was going to be late for sure, but when I got there everyone was outside and there were fire engines all lined up in front of school.

Notice that we didn't use the **exact words** from the notes.
