



Monday - Setting Description

Here are some pictures of Fort James. How is it different? How is it similar? Why did they set up a wall around the outside? Why do you think they struggled to survive here?




Tuesday - Character Description

Wednesday - Past tense

Wednesday - Past tense

The majority of words that are in the past tense end in -ed. These are regular past tense words.

For example: I jumped into the swimming pool.

However, some words have different endings. These are called irregular past tense. Can you organise these words into the past and present tense?

Clue: Try saying them in a sentence, do they make sense?

What is a verb?

What is an adverb?

How do the 2 link together?

A verb is a doing word, it is something that you can do.

Here are some examples of some of the most common verbs.



An adverb adds something to the verb, to tell you how that action is being done. It can be written in different ways in a sentence.

For example: Usain Bolt ran **quickly**.

Quickly, Usain Bolt ran down the track.

Usain Bolt **quickly** ran away from his competitors.
