

LO: I can use the present and past tense correctly.

Learning Ladder Pg. 12 (vi)

Yesterday, we looked at writing in the first person. **Today**, we will be focusing on **PAST TENSE VERBS**.

- First person - when the writer speaks about himself (I, my, me, us, we)
- Past tense - the event has already taken place
- Chronological order - dates/times
- Expanded noun phrases - adjectives
- Thoughts and feelings - emotions/ 5 senses
- Time connectives - next, after, later, before

Today, we will be looking at **past tense verbs**. First, let's have a look at the examples below:

Present tense

Past tense

I open my book. → I opened my book.

He is playing football today. → He played football today.

She is excited to see her birthday cake. → She was excited to see her birthday cake.

What did you notice about the past tense verbs?

Past tense verbs are created by adding (ed). However, this is not always the case. Complete the missing past tense verbs and write a sentence.

Rules to remember

For verbs that end in **y**, first add (i) and then (ed).

try → tr i ed
cry → cr i ed
dry → dr i ed

Can you think of any more? Write them in your book.

For verbs that end with a consonant - **NOT VOWELS** (A, E, I,O,U). You must double the **consonant BEFORE** adding the (ed).

stop → stop p (ed).
mop → mop p (ed).
chop → chop p (ed).
